Religion, the Public Sphere, and Religious Identity Formation 2013 ANNUAL MEETING in BOSTON – November 8-10, 2013

Our 2013 meeting will take place November 8-10 at the Westin Hotel in Waltham, MA, on the outskirts of Boston. The theme examines religious education in public and private schools, the role and contribution of religious communities in the public domain, and the relation of religious education to civic responsibility. Plenary speakers include <u>Walter Feinberg</u>, University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana, author of *For Goodness Sake: Religious Schools and Education for Democratic Citizenry*; <u>Diane L. Moore</u>, Harvard University, author of *Overcoming Religious Illiteracy: A Cultural Studies Approach to the Study of Religion in Secondary Education*; and <u>Robert (Bob) Jackson</u>, University of Warwick, author of *Rethinking Religious Education and Plurality: Issues in Diversity and Pedagogy*. Program Chair Siebren Miedema (VU University Amsterdam) is orchestrating speakers, events, and topics that will engage this complex topic with depth and imagination.

Robert (Bob) Jackson to receive the Harper Award

The <u>William Rainey Harper Award</u> is given to outstanding leaders whose work in other fields has had profound impact upon religious education. Professor Bob Jackson, who directed the largest research team in Europe dedicated to religions and education for almost twenty years, will receive the award at a banquet in his honor on Saturday evening at the 2013 Annual Meeting. The award recognizes Jackson's significant contribution to the study and advocacy of religions and education in the school experience of young people. First awarded in 1974, it is given only occasionally; Professor Jackson will receive the 12th Harper Award.

Important notice about PROCEEDINGS

REA's Board of Directors has determined that the papers delivered at the meeting will no longer be provided to members as <u>Proceedings</u> on a CD ROM in the program folders since papers are available in pdf format on the REA website. Hardcopies, which have been available for purchase in previous years, will not be produced this year. Instead, materials will be available on the meeting web set in a suitable format for download and assembly to create a disc or program book, if desired. This decision will save significant staff time and money.

REA becomes a Related Scholarly Organization of AAR

The Religious Education Association has been approved as a Related Scholarly Organization (RSO) of the <u>American Academy of Religion</u>! This designation does not only recognize the significant and historic status of REA, it also comes with several important benefits:
