The Director will be responsible for administrative service in all aspects of the Contextual Education program, including student internships associated with Master degree programs in STM, and will work collaboratively with the faculty and with appropriate administrators, students and staff of the School, the University and local community. The successful candidate will also be responsible for teaching three courses, with opportunities in the areas of pastoral/practical theology, education, leadership, ministry formation, spirituality, counseling, pastoral care skills or Clinical Pastoral Education supervision.

The ideal candidate will have demonstrated successful leadership as a program administrator; a strong background in experiential learning, theological reflection, discernment, leadership; proven administrative and interpersonal skills; and a demonstrated commitment to diversity and to the mission, vision, and values of the university and school are essential for this position.

Requirements: Ph.D., D.Min. or Ed.D. with specific expertise in practical theology or a closely related field is required; a demonstrated record of excellence as a teacher; and a minimum of five years pastoral experience.
