

Sheryl A. Kujawa-Holbrook, is a priest of the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles, an educator, historian of religion, and practical theologian, and a co-author with Fredrica Harris Thompsett of Born of Water, Born of Spirit: Supporting the Ministry of the Baptized in Small Congregations (2011). She is currently professor of practical theology and religious education at Claremont School of Theology and Claremont Lincoln University, and professor of Anglican Studies at Bloy House, the Episcopal Theological School at Claremont. In addition to her thirty years of experience as a teacher, trainer, workshop, conference and retreat leader, she is the author of thirteen books and numerous articles and reviews.

Before her academic career, Kujawa-Holbrook worked world-wide for the Episcopal Church in education and ministries with young people. She is on the boards of the Journal of Interreligious Dialogue (JIRD), the Kaleidoscope Institute (KI), and Religious Freedom USA, and the book review editor of Anglican and Episcopal History. In 2010-2011 Kujawa-Holbrook was a fellow in the Christian Leadership Initiative sponsored by the American Jewish Committee (AJC) and the Shalom Hartman Institute, Jerusalem, Israel.

Her interreligious works include, Pilgrimage – The Sacred Art. Journey to the Center of the Heart, SkyLight Paths 2013. She is the editor & co-author of, For One Great Peace. An Interfaith Study Guide. Abrahamic Faiths Peacemaking Initiative (2012); and, editor & co-author, Interfaith Peacemaking Curriculum. Abrahamic Faiths Initiative (2012).
