SHS is made up of two divisions: Preschool through Middle Schools (P-eighth grade) and Preparatory (grades nine through twelve). Today, SHS is a vibrant, thriving, and dynamic institution, committed to educational excellence and the teachings of a Christ as expressed in forgiveness, compassion, respect and generosity. From preschool through high school, our world-class, diverse faculty and staff guide students of all faiths to become thoughtful and caring young adults through a rigorous curriculum and mission-driven programs, the development of active leadership skills, and emphasis on personal integrity. The Position

SHS seeks a talented and highly qualified full-time Campus Ministry teacher at the Preparatory. The successful candidate collaborates with the Campus Ministry team and Religious Studies department to implement a vibrant, student-centered program that addresses the spiritual, ethical, and emotional needs of a religiously diverse student population.

Key responsibilities for this important role include but are not limited to:

- Contributes to all programs within the campus ministry department, including opportunities for works of charity and justice, immersion and reflection, spiritual retreats, faith sharing and prayer and worship.
- As determined by the Director of Campus Ministry, plans and directs all aspects of the designated campus ministry program area(s).
- Supports fellow campus ministers in supervision of and collaboration with departmental programming
- As needed, perform the tasks associated with teaching a course within the religious studies department.
- Builds effective relationships with students and faculty/staff to support their full participation in the program area(s) they direct, including guiding reflection and providing pastoral care as appropriate.
- Manages all logistics associated with their program area(s) including budget and other resources.
- Gathers, interprets, and reports data to assess overall program effectiveness and impact and to guide program improvement.
- Communicates the program's impact to the school community.
- Collaborates with colleagues to develop and renew curriculum and other school programs.
- Collaborates with colleagues to integrate campus ministry experiences with religious studies coursework and/or other academic disciplines.
- Contributes actively to build a vibrant faculty/staff learning culture.
- Maintains regularly scheduled office hours in order to advise and assist students.
- Maintains expertise in subject matter and pedagogy through professional development.
- Fulfills other duties as assigned by program director or school administrators.

Required Oualifications

- Bachelor's Degree in Theology, Religious Studies, Pastoral Ministry or related field.
- Three (3) or more years of experience in relevant campus ministry.
- A clear commitment to the mission and educational philosophy of Sacred Heart Schools as articulated in the Goals and Criteria of Sacred Heart education in the United States and Canada.
- Experiencing developing and facilitating retreats.
- A clear commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion and access, as well as inter-faith and inter-religious dialogue/education.
- Demonstrated experience working with underrepresented students specifically, low-income, first-generation, and racially/ethnically diverse student population.

- Strong cultural competency and pastoral sensitivity regarding transgender and gender non-conforming youth and their families.
- Demonstrated experience facilitating affinity groups.
- Exhibits a personality that demonstrates interpersonal skills to relate well across a variety of multicultural, multi-experience, multi-background audiences including students, staff, administration, parents and the community at large.
- Must be able to work independently with little supervision and work well on interdisciplinary teams.
- Knowledge of trends and issues in theology, campus ministry, and faith formation.
- Must be available to work a flexible schedule, including evening and weekend events.
- Must be available to travel domestically and internationally with minors.

Preferred Qualifications

- Masters degree in appropriate field, e.g., Theology, Religious Studies, Pastoral Ministry, Catholic School Leadership.
- Experience planning and leading retreats, service learning, or other spiritual formation activities.
- Willingness and ability to teach a course in appropriate subject, as needed.
